

Influencing the regulatory process

Your role as a stakeholder

All stakeholders can have a key role in influencing the development of Single European Sky (SES) implementing rules when developed by EUROCONTROL under mandate from the European Commission

The regulatory development process used by EUROCONTROL has been around for 11 years and has been applied successfully to develop most of the Commission's SES implementing rules as well as all of EUROCONTROL's Specifications. Also known as the EUROCONTROL Notice of Proposed Rule-Making (ENPRM) process, it has evolved comfortably to accommodate the changing needs of the European Commission and now EASA, and is already familiar to many States and stakeholders.

Our process is based on global best practice and has at its core the need to consult and involve stakeholders in developments. In fact, the input of stakeholders is essential right from the start of the process when options for regulatory approach are identified, up to end of the process to ensure that the draft rule is implementable. Your input is particularly important in helping us to avoid over-regulation by understanding the impacts and benefits on your organisation, no matter how large or small.

Your comments are never ignored. Each and every one of your inputs is reviewed and responses are provided and then made public.

So how can you have your say in the development of SES implementing rules and standardisation material?
